Welcome to Webeloree 2021!

A Webelos Scout's quest toward their Arrow of Light Award is an important one. They are learning new skills and growing toward becoming an independent young person and transitioning into Scouts BSA.

At Webeloree, we understand the needs of Webelos Scouts and provide an action-packed, fun-filled, exciting weekend they will not soon forget!

This booklet contains information your Webelos will need to have a successful and fun time at this year's event at Knox Scout Reservation (KSR). Be sure to read **all** information carefully as we expect participants to act in accordance with the best Scouting traditions and **follow all BSA prescribed COVID-19 safety guidance** (available at <https://www.scouting.org/coronavirus/covid-19-faq/>). This event will place an emphasis on Scouts acting within the Oath, Law, and motto of Scouts BSA — “Do Your Best.” No Den will be eligible to win awards if the Webeloree Chair, Assistant Chair, or any Staff has to correct Dens' behavior. We expect Den Leaders and parents to supervise their Scouts and maintain safety and discipline at all times. Staff will wear STAFF identification on their uniforms or T-Shirts.

Pack Coordinator

This is very important to ensure a successful event. Pack coordinators must register their group online (www.gacacouncil.org) by the registration deadline of **October 15, 2021** to enable Webeloree Staff to secure T-Shirts for participants. For small packs, a parent may serve in this capacity and register all attendees.

If a pack does not submit a name to the council, we will use the primary pack contact as the Pack Coordinator. The Pack Coordinator will be the main conduit for communication from the Event Chair to the pack.

We will distribute detailed program information to the Pack Coordinators via email. Please ensure your Pack Coordinator provides us with an accurate email address. **The Pack Coordinator will be responsible for checking the pack in at Friday night's Leader meeting and checking-out their Pack & picking up all medical forms on Sunday following the Closing Ceremony.**

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The registration fee is **\$35** for one Webelos Scout **and** one adult.
Additional Webelos Scouts are **\$30** per Webelos Scout, additional Adults are **\$10**
Example: Two adults with two Webelos Scouts: \$35+\$30+\$10=\$75
Additional T-Shirts for Adults can be purchased for \$10 (Adult S/M/L/XL), \$12 (2XL/3XL), or \$14 (4XL)
Pack Coordinators are responsible for registering their Pack **online**
by 4:00 PM on Friday, October 15, 2021 to receive a T-Shirt.

Registration deadline to receive a T-Shirt is October 15th, 2021 by 4 PM. For those not wanting a T-Shirt, final registration closes Thursday, November 11th 2021.

Pack Coordinators can specify earlier deadlines for their packs to facilitate meeting this deadline.

NO UNIT WILL BE ALLOWED TO REGISTER AT CHECK-IN.

- **PERMISSION FORMS:** No Scout will be allowed to participate in the Webeloree without a properly signed permission form. This permission form is located on the online registration form.
- **MEDICAL FORMS:** All participants must submit a BSA Annual Health & Medical Record. This form is located on the council's website (www.gacacouncil.org). **Pack Coordinators must provide ALL of their Pack's registered attendee's medical forms and registration forms to the KSR Admin office Friday, November 12th and Pick it up on Sunday, November 14th.**

NOTE: This event will take place rain or shine. THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS EXCEPT IN THE EVENT OF CANCELLATION BY COUNCIL!

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What to expect at Check- In:

Check-in will start Friday evening at 5:00 P.M.. **Please do not arrive prior to this time unless you are coming between 3:00 to 4:30 PM to unload a vehicle or drop off a trailer.**

The following information **MUST be submitted by the Pack Coordinator or designee at the Leader Meeting.**

- **Any changes** from the original Pack Registration Form submitted online with applicable Registration Fees
- Medical forms for ALL attendees in a folder or notebook of some sort. (No loose forms accepted.)

Information

There will be an information station setup near the check-in area to help guide campers to their designated camping areas. A small map of the area will be e-mailed to all Pack Coordinators the week prior to the event. A copy of the map will also be posted on the Information Board located across the drive-in front of the Administration Building. If any further assistance is needed during the event, please see a Webeloree Staff Member or an assistant in the Administration Building (Admin).

Vehicles in Camp

Vehicles are NOT ALLOWED in Campsites – National Policy! No Exceptions!!

- BSA regulations prohibit leaving parked vehicles at Campsites. Friday night campers will be permitted, **in coordination with Staff**, to drive vehicles to designated drop-off locations at/near their assigned campsite to unload equipment and promptly return vehicles to the general parking areas. **ALL VEHICLES MUST BE OUT OF CAMPSITE AREAS BY 5:00 PM FRIDAY EVENING.** Those units who wish to bring their gear prior to Friday must coordinate beforehand with event staff.
- Each unit may drop off **ONE** utility trailer at their assigned campsite, but must ensure it does not obstruct any walkways, is clearly within their unit's assigned campsite, is standalone (no attached vehicle), and **cannot be moved** until conclusion of campout Sunday morning as directed by Staff.
- Saturday night campers **MAY** be permitted to drive vehicles to their campsite between designated hours (to be determined) with **staff approval** in order to unload equipment then promptly return their vehicles to the parking area. This is subject to change based on any number of factors; **STAFF WILL PROVIDE GUIDANCE.**
- Staff will be present to coordinate and assist with getting gear to and from campsites **SAFELY** and promptly. **PLEASE DO NOT** drive vehicles into campsites for any reason without first coordinating with Staff.

First Aid

Small needs should be tended to at the campsite using Pack first aid supplies and trained adult leaders. Larger needs should be directed to First Aid located inside Admin. Medications may be stored in First Aid.

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Camping

Camping on Friday and/or Saturday night is highly encouraged, but optional. There is no additional charge for camping. Please indicate online, during Pack Registration, the number of campers for each night. We will assign campsites based on those numbers. Campsites are assigned based on the **number of campers**. All campers will have access to water and electricity at their nearest pavilion. Port-o-lets will be located in areas near campers. Being prepared by bringing water with you will eliminate waiting in line at the pavilions. **Sanitation efforts will be coordinated by the Pack Coordinator with Webeloree organizers prior to the event to ensure sanitation supplies and procedures are in place for the duration of the event. Adults (not youth) should be in charge of sanitation efforts. Facial coverings or masks are encouraged when social distancing is not possible.**

***Packs with medical needs for electricity MUST indicate this on their registration form. We will not be able to relocate a pack at check-in. If large numbers of those with medical needs are attending, we will create a 'Medical Only' camping area near a pavilion and no non-medical needs campers will be allowed there.**

Meals

Due to current safety procedures, we will NOT be providing meals this year. All dens are encouraged to use one or more of the meals (Sat/Sun breakfast & Saturday lunch, dinner) to fulfill their Dutch oven cooking requirement. Snacks, beverages, and candy may be available at our Trading Post, but do not plan on this for necessities.

All Packs are strongly encouraged to use PERSONAL mess kits for meals. This helps reduce the amount of trash we produce at Knox Scout Reservation and aids with clean up.

Wristbands

All attendees will receive wristbands from the Pack Coordinator. The wristband must be worn for the duration of the event. Wristbands will help with identification & are required for the Lost Scout Plan.

T-Shirts

All Webelos Scouts will receive a T-shirt with paid registration **by October 15th, 2021**. T-shirts will be available for pick up by the Pack Coordinator during the Friday evening Leader Meeting. **Please indicate T-shirt size during online registration.**

Adults may pre-order T-shirts online as well. A limited number of adult T-shirts will be available for purchase in the Trading Post. There will be no orders placed after the event.

Water Bottles

No disposable cups will be available at Webeloree! As explained under meals, extra points for your troop if everyone has a REAL water bottle with them.

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Patches

All paid attendees will receive a patch (scouts and adults). We will be ordering patches before the event.

Check – Out

For packs not camping, check out will be after the campfire in the Admin office. For packs camping, check-out will be AFTER the Pack's campsite has been cleaned, all trash removed, and the site is inspected by a member of the Webeloree staff. (Please remove your trash and take to the nearest trash dumpster – behind Sewell Center.) Leave No Trace will be in full force for the event.

Dens

Each Pack should group scouts into Dens. The Dens should be formed based on rank – Webelos I and Webelos II. The den size should be 5 to 6 scouts as some activities require this size group. Dens with 11 scouts or more should be broken into two smaller dens; no den size should exceed 10 scouts. Extra small Dens can be combined, not to exceed 10 at maximum.

Dens may include scouts that are different ranks. At a minimum, each den needs a Den Leader (preferably their own). If the Den Leader or Assistant Den Leader is not available, the Pack must assign at least one parent to lead the Den during the program.

Dens will be together for: Opening Ceremony, Lunch, Den Competitions, Songs or Skits during Campfire Ceremony, Scout's Own Service and Closing Ceremony. At other times, Scouts will attend sessions as per their individual schedules. Free Time may include: hiking, fishing, knot tying, practicing for campfire skits, working on scouting skills, visiting Trading Post, competing in Den competitions, learning to play a sport and showing scout spirit.

Den Competitions

The following events will have participant, first, second and third place ribbons awarded for Den Flags at the Closing Ceremony on Sunday: (Please bring your Den and Pack Flags to the Closing Ceremony.) **Fire Starting, Square Knot Relay and other relay races will be open after classes have ended through 5:00PM. Stop by when you have free time and please avoid gathering while other groups are at the stations to reduce crowding.

- Den Campsite (organization, cleanliness, leave no trace, etc.)
- Water Bottle Rockets****
- Square Knot Relay (best times)
- Chili Cookoff
- Scout Spirit
- Fire Starting (best times)
- Pack relay races (best times)

******All Dens MUST create their den Water Bottle Rocket prior to the event and bring it with them to Webeloree. We will NOT be making rockets at Webeloree. This year's Rocket Launch will be clearly marked to ensure safety for ALL participants. Failure to follow the guidance, entering another group's designated area, or entering the roped-off launch area will result in im-**

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mediate disqualification from the competition. We ask that Pack leaders and Adults help ensure Webelos stay in designated area during this event as it is always a popular event for the youth!

Trading Post

The KSR Trading Post is now located in the back of Sewell Hall!! The trading post may be open at various times throughout the weekend to include after the campfire ceremony. The Trading Post carries various snacks, beverages, candy, ice cream treats, scout items and KSR items. Cash, Check and credit cards accepted. Times will be posted on the Trading Post door and announced during the Friday evening Leader meeting.

What to Wear

Class A (field) uniforms should be worn for: Opening, Closing, Campfire, and Scouts Own Service.

(Helpful hint: Scouts should wear the Scout t-shirt underneath their Class A uniform during the opening ceremony, then remove the Class A shirt, fold it and store in their day pack for later wear.)

- Optional Items: Camera, Webelos Handbook, Fishing Gear, Book of Religious Faith, items for campfire skit

SPORTS: The gaga ball pit and human foosball pit will NOT be available this year as it is not practical for social distancing. Those areas will be marked off to remind participants.

Volunteer Opportunities

Webeloree is always looking for great adult volunteers as well as Scout BSA volunteers over the age of 14 (with SM recommendation). Volunteers **MUST** have completed the following training: **Current** Youth Protection, and Hazardous Weather. First Aid and CPR training are a plus! 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Schedule Alteration & Attendance

Times for the Campfire Ceremony and Closing Ceremony **will NOT be changed** except in the event of an emergency. Please be understanding and encourage Scout-like behavior. Remember a Scout is: trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, cheerful, obedient, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent.

Also, if leaving the campfire early, **please do NOT leave** in the middle of a skit. It upsets Scouts when groups of people leave during their performance. Also, please remember cheerful applause is uplifting and encouraging!

(Locations for each session will be given out at the Leader meeting on Friday night.)

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Event Session Descriptions:

- **Adventures in Science:** Requirements 1 and 3 will be covered over two, (2), sessions in camp. Requirement 2 will need to be completed at the Den level.
- **Art Explosion:** All requirements of the Adventure will be completed at the event.
- **Aware and Care:** All requirements for the Aware and Care Adventure will be completed in camp.
- **Castaway:** All elements of the Adventure can be completed in camp. Please have your scouts attempt to assemble a small outdoor survival kit (**i.e., one or two ways to start a fire, something to signal with, duct tape, small safety pins, fishing line, needles, gallon sized Ziploc freezer bag, large trash bag, small wooden pencil, small sheets of paper, para-cord, small pocket knife**), before Webeloree and bring it with them.
See Appendix on page 20-21 for additional Castaway information.
- **Earth Rocks!:** Teaches all requirements for the Adventure and will be completed at the event.
- **Engineer:** Teaches the needed requirements for the Engineer Adventure and will be completed at the event.
- **Into the woods:** Teaches the needed requirements for Into the Woods and will be completed at the event.
- **Fix It:** Gives scouts the opportunity to use tools and satisfy the requirements for their Fix It Adventure. This Adventure will be split into two (2), sessions. Both sessions are required to complete the Adventure at Webelos-Rec.
- **Building a Better World:** Requirement 4 Opportunity: Meet with a government or community leader, and learn about his or her role in your community. Discuss with the leader an important issue facing your community.
- **First Responder:** Teaches all needed requirements of the First Responder Adventure. This event will run for two (2), sessions and requires both sessions to complete the Adventure.
- **Adventures in Scouting (Arrow of Light only):** Prepares Webelos II youth for Scouts BSA by learning the Scout Oath, Law, Motto, and Slogan. Explains the Patrol Method, Scout spirit, including the Scout sign, salute, and handshake. Allows Webelos to attend a Scout meeting and learn to tie a square knot, two half hitches, and taut-line. Webelos will also learn to whip and fuse a rope. This session does not complete the Adventures in Scouting Requirement, but satisfies all Requirements 1, 2, 5, 6 and portions of Requirement 3. If your Den practices the Patrol Method for the event, Requirement 4 is also satisfied!
- **Den Competitions** will consist of several quick, team building games. **Plus, the opportunity to earn more points to have the overall **highest score and possibly** be crowned the **BEST PATROL OF WEBELOREE!****

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Q: If this program is designed around the patrol method, what is the role of the Cub Master/Pack Coordinator?

A: Their role is to coordinate their dens' registration, coordinate with the Event Chairs, keep track of medical forms, class schedules, etc. and ensure our Scouts and families have fun!

Q: Are Den Leaders required to stay with their dens?

A: Yes, during Den times. During rotating sessions, parents/leaders should accompany their Webelos Scouts.

Q: What if I do not want to camp?

A: Camping is a vital part of Scouts BSA and is highly encouraged, however, if you cannot camp, you can still participate in the program, which runs from 8 am to 9:30 pm on Saturday. You can camp on Friday night, Saturday night or both nights at no additional cost. If you do not camp on Friday night, please arrive at Camp Knox no later than 7:30 AM on Saturday as Check In will close at 8:00 am.

Q: What if a family changed their mind and wants to attend after the Pack submitted the Pack's registration? (Late Registration)

A: Contact the Event Chair. The Event Chair will handle each situation on a case-by-case basis. Online registration does not allow for late registrations. However, in the event of an emergency, the event chair may make an exception. (Forgetting to register is NOT an emergency.)

Q: You only asked for one parent/leader to walk around with each den. What about two deep leadership?

A: All the groups will be located in the same area and will be visible to other groups. The dens will not be alone with only one leader. If the den leaves the program area, the Den Leader needs to ensure there are at least two adults with the group.

Q: If I show up at noon, will I be able to drive my gear to the campsite?

A: No. A vehicle can only be driven to the campsite to drop a trailer before Check-In and at Check-Out as shown on the schedule. During these times the vehicle must also have a vehicle pass issued by event staff.

Q: How much does it cost?

A: **\$35** for a Scout and a parent or adult partner. Additional Webelos are **\$30** (For families with two Webelos). Additional Adults are **\$10**

Q: I have a Webelos Scout who wants to attend but cannot afford it. What can I do?

A: Cub Masters/Pack coordinators who have Webelos in need of financial assistance should contact the Council Executive, Mr. Dan Rogers.

(Please refrain from any of the following which are prohibited by BSA: pretend use of weapons, wasting of food or water, cross-gender, relating to any bodily functions, foul language and anything that may insult a person, group, race, sex, religion, etc.)

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Robert E. Knox Scout Reservation Rules – Revised 6/1/2010

Rules are made for the safety of participants, protection of the facility, and to provide fairness to all. Please notify all participants of the following:

- ❖ **WEAPONS:** No firearms, bows and arrows, or ammunition of any kind may be kept in the possession of a Scout or Scouter. No axes are permitted or needed. Hatchets may be used by Scouts BSA Youth or Adult Leaders only. No fireworks of any kind are permitted on camp property. No fixed blade, sheath, or other survival knives are permitted. Folding or pocket knives are permitted by those scouts that have earned their Whittlin' Chip.
- ❖ **VEHICLES:** The speed limit for vehicles is 3MPH (walking speed). One person per seatbelt and they must be worn. No riding in truck beds. No motor-homes, RVs, campers, or generators.
- ❖ **ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO:** No alcoholic beverages or unlawful drugs are permitted on camp property or at any Scouts BSA events. Tobacco use is permitted only in designated areas (a designated area will be provided at check-in, if you need). BSA guidelines require a smoke-free environment for our Scouts. If you must smoke, please do so out of sight of youth participants and not inside any buildings. Please “field dress” your butts and dispose of them properly remembering the ever present danger of forest fires.
- ❖ **ATTIRE:** Closed toe shoes must be worn in camp at all times. Walk, do not run, within your campsite. Remember tent stakes and tie downs. The Scout uniform, correctly worn, is the most proper dress.
- ❖ **Anyone** leaving the event must sign out at the Admin Building and must sign back in upon return.
- ❖ **LEADERSHIP:** A Pack must have Pack leadership at all times during the event. The Buddy System should be used at all times.
- ❖ **PETS:** Pets are not allowed at camp. Please, for the safety of other campers and the pet, leave them at home.
- ❖ **LEAVE NO TRACE:** Leave No Trace guidelines are to be followed. Trash your trash. Leave nothing but footprints, take nothing but pictures.
- ❖ **CAMP AND LAKE:** Follow BSA guidelines for camping. Stay out of the lake. No water craft/swimming permitted.
- ❖ **ELECTRONIC DEVICES AND BIKES:** No electronic devices or bikes are to be brought into camp. Parents only may carry cell phones or two-way radios. The staff will be on channel 1.
- ❖ **STOVES AND LANTERNS:** Follow BSA regulations according to fuels. **Keep open flames out of and away from tents. Please refer to the BSA Guide to Safe Scouting section on “Chemical Fuels and Equipment”.** See link (<https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/gss06/>)
- ❖ **FIRES:** FIRES WILL BE ALLOWED IN DESIGNATED FIRE CIRCLES ONLY. Do not cut trees. Bring your firewood, charcoal or collect dead wood from the ground. No pit/trench fires; use the rings provided. Never leave a fire unattended, especially when going to bed. All fires should be extinguished according to BSA guidelines.
- ❖ **ROCKS AND STICKS:** Although tempting, rocks must not be thrown or kicked and sticks may not be swung. Injury/damage to property usually results from this action. Such actions will result in you being asked to leave the campout immediately. Adult Leaders please help monitor your scouts.

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- ❖ **FIRST AID:** The Health Lodge (at the Admin building) will be manned during the event. Medical Emergencies should be directed through Admin during other hours. Minor first aid should be handled at the campsite if you have supplies. Medications for all Scouts and Scouters will be kept at the Health Lodge and administered by the Health Officer.

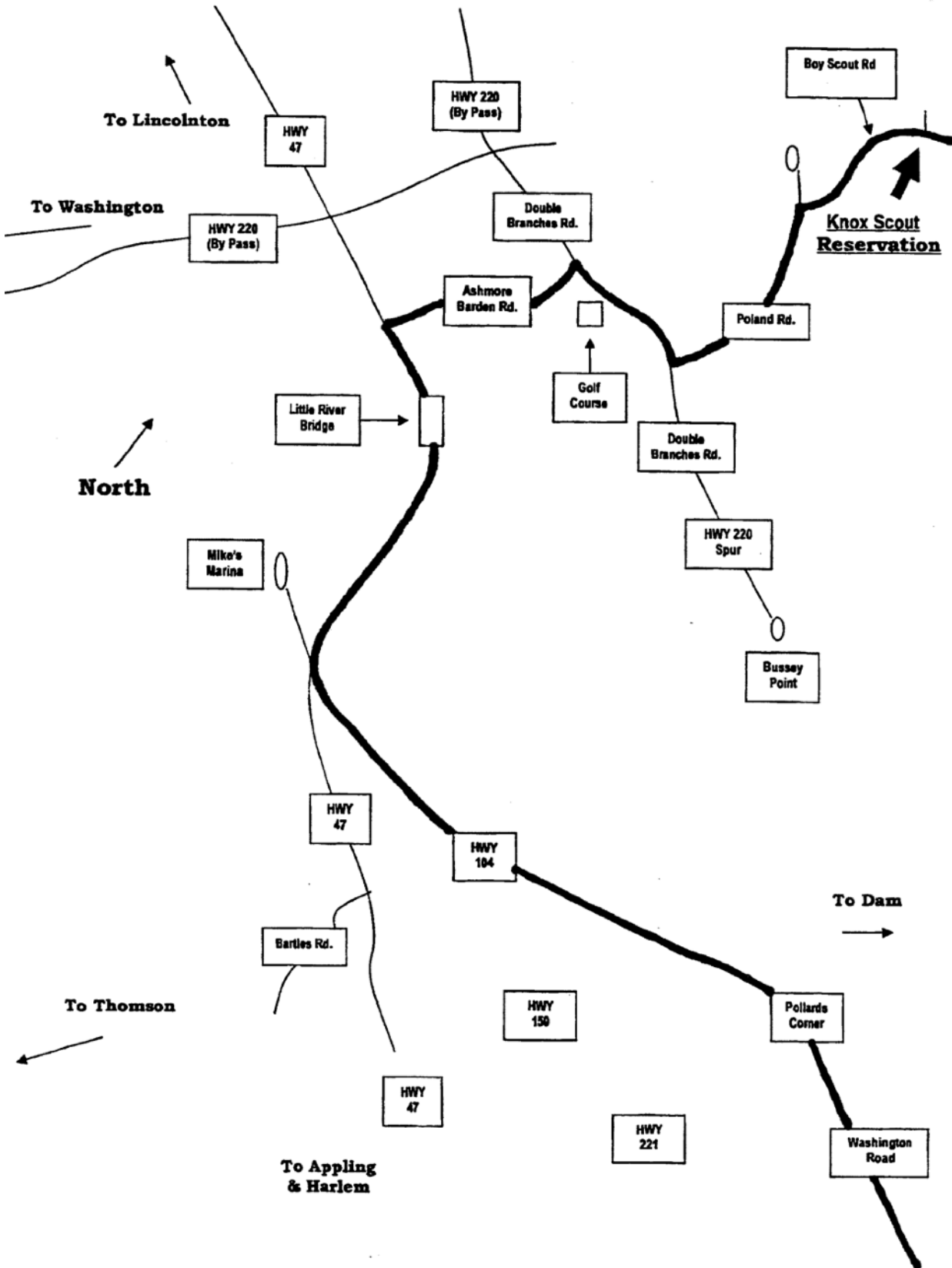
1. Go west on I-20. In Georgia take Exit 194, (Belair Road / Dyess Parkway / Highway 383)

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APPENDIX – Additional Castaway Items

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Castaway

For those Webelos who want to do the Castaway elective at Webeloree we will be working on completing all requirements except for 1 a. which should be done with the den in camp. We will be doing Requirement 1 b. The instructor will provide some alternative means to start fire, but if the individual Webelos wish to bring an interesting alternative means to start fire, we will try to work it in to the instruction. If there are adequate downed branches available we may also attempt to do requirement 1 c (the Webelos must perform only one of the requirements under 1 but we may try two). For Requirement 2 b each Webelos should assemble his own kit. Here are some ideas. These are just ideas and not instructions, each Webelos should think about what he thinks should go into a kit and why. We will be discussing individual kits. There might be some great insights!

Survival kit:

A survival kit should be small, resistant to moisture, and should have some essentials that might make an unexpected overnight stay in the woods a little safer and maybe even a little more comfortable. First, every kit should be in some kind of container. Many years ago, when Band-Aids came in metal tins those made excellent survival kits. Today, one of the most popular containers is an Altoids tin. Here are some other things to think about:

-One or two ways to start a fire. An example would be three or four waterproof matches. (You can make your own by dipping the heads of regular kitchen matches in melted wax or painting over them with some clear nail polish). Ferro rods or other spark producing items are a good thing for your kit. Maybe include a small piece of tinder like a wad of dryer lint or a couple cotton balls. (Cotton balls saturated in Vaseline are water resistant, light easily, and burn much longer than just plain cotton).

-Something to signal with. A whistle is a good idea. Maybe a signal mirror. (Some people have polished the inside of the lid of their Altoids survival kit so it shines like a mirror.)

-A few feet of duct tape wrapped into a tight cylinder can be a bit of magic in an emergency. There are so many uses it would be hard to list them all.

-A couple feet of heavy duty aluminum foil folded up tightly.

-A few small safety pins.

-10 ft fishing line, three or four #6 or #8 hooks and a few split shot weights. (There are more uses for all of these than just fishing!)

Castaway (Continued)

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-Two or three needles (look up how to magnetize them on the internet...we might learn how to use them as an emergency compass!)

-A gallon sized Ziploc freezer bag (could be used to hold the kit...)

-A large trash bag, folded up.

-Small wooden pencil

-a few small sheets of paper (post-it notes size)

-A few feet of para-cord

-Small pocket knife (either in the kit or in your pocket...if you have your whittlin' chip)

Think of other or alternate items and different containers. Keep your kit small, compact, and in one container. It should fit in your pocket.
